

## **Activities to Develop Language, Math, Card and Board game skills for primary students with Autism Spectrum Disorder**

The goal of this workshop is to teach you a variety of language, math, board and card game activities to play at home with your child. Along with teaching literacy and numeracy skills, these games will assist your child to develop turn taking and social skills and teach them the skill of playing a game with a friend.

The workshop will consist of three centres with a different focus at each centre. At the language centre you will learn a variety of matching, memory and bingo games. You will learn how to make simple books to teach your child to read and how to use the Olwein reading grids to teach sight words.

At the math centre you will learn a variety of dice games to develop number, sequencing and social skills.

At the card game centre you will learn a variety of games to play at home with your child and siblings. Card games develop numeracy skills, sequencing, turn taking and social skills.
