



### **Colour the World**

*Colour the World* will help students explore world issues and express themselves through hands-on crafts such as constructing kites, graphic tees, body art and more. Students will discover ways to use art and media to raise awareness and inspire others to share their passion for social change. This workshop will not only inform, but encourage participants to ACTup! So, put away the books and find your creative escape.

### **Rhythmic Renegade Revolution**

Music is a powerful way to deliver messages of hope and change. In this interactive workshop, students will discover how well-known artists are inspiring others and then work together to develop their own musical revolution by creating their instruments and composing a song.

### **Lights, Camera, Issues!**

Photojournalism has helped to bring awareness to various global issues. Images tell a powerful story. In this workshop, students will explore various world issues through photography and film, including child labour in sweat shops, racial hate crimes, global warming, animal testing and the Darfur genocide.

### **Street Art Promoting World Issues**

Street art is a great communicator of issues faced by the population. In this workshop, students will work with a local street artist to discover how to raise awareness with chalk and paint. Topics discussed will include street gangs, sweatshops, media censorship, and deforestation. Students will also discuss their opinions of other world issues.

### **Boot Camp**

Students will acquire a sense of trust and team-building skills as they are positioned in a variety of activities involving mental and physical applications. The purpose of this workshop is to solve various world issues by working together as a team rather than attacking the issue on an individual level. Taking action by “physically” working together to reach a common goal is more effective than an individual’s own efforts.

### **Voice Your Choice**

The purpose of this workshop is to encourage students to voice their opinions through various forms of language and literature. Students will be educated through the power of words using the techniques of poetic expression, speech creation and spoken word. The world issues that

will be covered are human trafficking of children, arms trade and drug use among street children.

### **One Day at a Time**

In this workshop, students will leave their lives behind and enter the lives of children living in Africa. Students will choose their fate as they choose the story they want to act out. The stories come from actual children living with HIV, through child hunger, working in sweatshops and terrorism and will be acted out through skits, games, rhythms, song and other drama activities. Each group will work together and share their ideas to make their story on life more believable. At the end the groups will present their story to the rest of the students.
