HOSPITALITY AND TOURISM

In order to meet the high demand in the coming years for quality skilled workers in the Hospitality and Tourism Industry, Glenforest Secondary School is excited to offer this unique program. The Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) program involves students completing a package of courses that meet the needs of all students with an interest in developing the skills necessary for a career in the Hospitality and Tourism Industry. The Hospitality and Tourism Industry acknowledges and supports the program through certification and appropriate industry placements.

In order to compete an SHSM in Hospitality and Tourism students:

1. Complete a bundle of 9 specific courses (see chart below);
2. Complete Sector Certifications and/or training programs;
3. Participate in experiential learning and career exploration activities within the sector (e.g. co-op work experience, job shadowing, job twinning);
4. Learn and document the industry Essential Skills and work habits using the Ontario Skills Passport;
5. Gain "Reach Ahead" experience connected to the student's post-secondary plans.
