### REGIONAL PROGRAM

#### INTERNATIONAL AND EXECUTIVE LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

Learn to lead, inspire and achieve through Peel District School Board's first and only leadership regional program. The International and Executive Leadership Academy is a four-year rigorous and technologically engaging curriculum designed to develop active and engaged citizens in the global community. This Academy will teach students to be the leaders of the 21st century by teaching responsibility and developing their personal, civic, community and global leadership skills. Over four years, students will also have the opportunity to obtain a bronze, silver or gold level of the prestigious Duke of Edinburgh Award, an internationally recognized award of distinction. Students will routinely participate in experiential learning opportunities including over-night camps, local and province-wide field trips and excursions and by attending conferences inside and outside of the GTA. Students will plan and administer local and community events, participate in a variety of volunteer experiences and will connect with local businesses and public sector organizations to hone their leadership skills. Students will graduate from the program with a T. L. Kennedy, International and Executive Leadership Academy diploma.

The International and Executive Leadership Academy aligns with T. L. Kennedy's existing Specialist High Skills Majors (SHSM) for students in grade 11. Students entering grade 11 from the International and Executive Leadership Academy will have the option to also enrol in one of our Specialist High Skills Major programs (Information Communication Technology or Business Administration). Those leadership students who choose to pursue one of the SHSM programs will meet the graduation requirements of that program and will receive a "red seal" SHSM designation on their OSSD at graduation, in addition to receiving the International and Executive Leadership Academy diploma.

Increasingly, post-secondary institutions are expanding their admission criteria into certain programs to not just include marks but to include leadership experiences and skills. Many university and college programs are requesting personal statements and essays that require students to highlight leadership experiences and how these leadership skills can transfer into the college and university pathways. Additionally, many scholarships are granted to those students who demonstrate leadership skills and experiences.

The International and Executive Leadership Academy is open to students of all pathways across the entire Peel District School Board and beyond. As it is a regional program, students must apply to the program by November 2019. More information about the program and admission will be shared at the Regional Information Night in October 2019.

Students of the International and Executive Leadership Academy will meet all the requirements to successfully obtain an Ontario Secondary School Diploma. Included in the 30 credit count, students will take two Leadership courses each year. Each year of the program progressively develops leadership skills and experiences. Students of the Academy will select the below courses in the respective years.

**REGIONAL PROGRAM**

**GRAPHIC & DESIGN MANAGEMENT (GDM)**

The Graphic & Design Management (GDM) program focuses on the many pathways related to design such as graphic, fashion, architecture, video game design and animation, interior design, urban design, industrial design, engineering, and packaging design.

T.L. Kennedy offers this challenging technology-based program to students in the Peel District School Board. Our students will acquire specific qualifications required to pursue various fields of study beyond high school.

Students who complete their certification in Graphic & Design Management can apply to programs at OCAD University, Sheridan College, Ryerson University, York University, George Brown College, Seneca College, Western University, Wilfrid Laurier University, University of Waterloo and the University of Toronto.

Students will also participate in exciting design challenges through the Canadian Design Exchange Museum, National Yearbook Review, Robotics, and the Phoenix Challenge.

Students will gain valuable experience in all aspects of the design industry with guest speakers and field trips relevant to their specific needs and interests.

## REGIONAL PROGRAM

### INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS AND TECHNOLOGY (IBT)

The International Business and Technology Program is one of the two regional programs offered at T.L. Kennedy Secondary School.

The International, Business and Technology (IBT) Program is an innovative program which enriches and extends the secondary school curriculum to prepare students for the challenges of an increasingly complex world.

In grades nine and ten, IBT students receive a solid foundation in international studies, business and technology courses. During their senior years, students may choose courses that lead to specialization in one of the three areas or continue to develop a broad perspective by continuing to study a variety of subjects.

With the co-operation of the community and business partners, students are engaged in educational experiences which provide them with a competitive edge in a global market. Our business partners play an important role in the development and maintenance of the IBT Program by enhancing students' learning and preparing them for future employment. In return, corporate partners benefit as our students graduate with 21<sup>st</sup> century employability skills.

Students in the T.L. Kennedy boundary may apply in grade 8 to the IBT program.

The Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) at TLKSS involves students completing a package of 9 courses that meets the needs of all students with an interest in developing the skills necessary for a career in Business Administration, Business Management, Accounting, Finance and Investment Industry. The Business Administration and Management Industry acknowledges and supports the program through certifications and appropriate industry co-operative learning placements.

The SHSM program includes the following criteria:

1. Complete a bundle of 9 specific courses including 4 major credits in Business Studies, 3 other required credits in English and Math and 2 co-op credits (see chart below).
2. Achieve valuable industry certifications (e.g., First Aid, CPR, WHMIS, Customer Service, Leadership, etc.).
3. Participate in experiential learning and career exploration activities within the sector (e.g. co-op work experience, workshops, conferences and interactive learning activities at various organizations).
4. Learn about Innovation, Creativity and Entrepreneurship (ICE) or Coding through a Sector Partner Contextualized Experience (SPCE).
5. Gain "Reach Ahead" experiences connected to the student's post-secondary plans.

The Information and Communications Technology/Computer Science Industry acknowledges and supports the program through certifications and appropriate industry co-operative learning placements.

The SHSM program includes the following criteria:

1. Complete a bundle of 9 specific courses including 4 major credits in Information and Communications Technology, 2 credits in English and Math, 1 other required credit and 2 co-op credits (see chart below).
2. Achieve valuable industry certifications (e.g., First Aid, CPR, WHMIS, Leadership, Portfolio Development, etc.).
3. Participate in experiential learning and career exploration activities within the sector (e.g. co-op work experience, workshops, conferences and interactive learning activities at various organizations).
4. Learn about Innovation, Creativity and Entrepreneurship (ICE) or Coding through a Sector Partner Contextualized Experience (SPCE).
5. Gain “Reach Ahead” experiences connected to the student’s post-secondary plans.
