Applewood Heights offers a robust mainstream program in all curricular areas, for all grades, including the French Immersion program.

Applewood Heights offers a Regional Sports Program (RSP) open to all eligible students in Peel. Applications allow entry at the end of Grade 8. RSP students will participate in physical education all year and also engage in leadership opportunities within the school and neighbouring community. Students may also choose to complete a SHSM (Specialist High Skills Major) in Sports. SHSM students in Grades 11 and 12 are engaged in a program that provides focused courses on sports and leadership combined with additional sector certifications and experiences that are linked to post-secondary plans.

The school's extracurricular program offers students a complete range of athletic teams, music groups and a variety of clubs and organizations in which to get involved.

## SPECIALIST HIGH SKILLS MAJOR (SHSM)

### SPORTS

In order to meet the high demand in the coming years for quality skilled workers in the Sports Industry, Applewood Heights Secondary School is excited to offer this unique program. The Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) program involves students completing a package of 9 courses that meets the needs of all students with an interest in developing the skills necessary for a career in the Sports Industry. The Sports industry acknowledges and supports the program through certification and appropriate industry cooperative learning placements.

In order to earn a SHSM Red Seal Diploma in Sports, students:

1. Complete a bundle of 9 specific courses (see chart below) including 2 cooperative education credits taken in day school in the grade 11 school year;
2. Complete 6 Certifications and/or training programs;
3. Participate in Experiential Learning and career exploration activities within the sector (e.g. job shadowing, job twinning);
4. Gain "Reach Ahead" experience connected to the student's post-secondary plans.
5. Complete a Sector-Partnered Experience (SPE) in one of 3 areas: Coding; Innovation, Creativity & Entrepreneurship (ICE); or Mathematics.
