## SPECIALIST HIGH SKILLS MAJOR (SHSM)

### ARTS AND CULTURE

In order to meet the high demand in the coming years for quality skilled workers in the Arts and Culture Industry, Cawthra Park Secondary School is excited to offer this unique program. The Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM) program involves students completing a package of 8 courses that meet the needs of all students with an interest in developing the skills necessary for a career in the Arts. The Arts and Culture industry acknowledges and supports the program through certification and appropriate industry cooperative learning placements.

In order to earn a SHSM Red Seal Diploma in Arts and Culture, students:

1. Complete a bundle of 8 specific courses (see chart below) including 2 cooperative education credits taken in day school in the grade 11 school year;
2. Complete 7 Certifications and/or training programs;
3. Participate in Experiential Learning and career exploration activities within the sector (e.g. job shadowing, job twinning);
4. Gain "Reach Ahead" experience connected to the student's post-secondary plans.
5. Complete a Sector-Partnered Experience (SPE) in one of 3 areas: Coding; Innovation, Creativity & Entrepreneurship (ICE); or Mathematics.
