More about Peel Alternative:

Peel Alternative School offers an alternative program for Peel students in Grades 6 to 12 whose needs are better addressed in a smaller educational setting. The secondary programs include:

- ❖ Intermediate Alternative Program – for Grade 9 and 10 students in their first two years of high school. Students attend school every day.
- ❖ Intermediate ISR Program – for students in Grade 10 in their second year of high school. Students attend school every day.
- ❖ Foundations – for Grade 9 and 10 students in at least their third year of high school. Students attend 2 hours/week per course.
- ❖ Senior – for Grade 11 and 12 students in at least their third year of high school. Students attend 2 hours/week per course.
- ❖ TEAM – for teen mothers. Students attend school 2 days a week.
- ❖ mPLAR – Mature Prior Learning Assessment and Recognition for students over 18. Students attend 8 hours/week.
- ❖ Experiential Credit Programs – North: Fit 2 Lead, Staged, Roots of Freedom, Wilderness Experience. South: Fit 2 Lead, Music Biz, Technautics, Life Skills.

PAS QUEST:

Experiential, 1-credit program, focusing on providing students with an opportunity to earn a credit while working to transition smoothly to the alternative learning environment.

Course selection may include:

- IDP 3OG

MULTI-CREDIT PROGRAMS:

Experiential, 2-credit, 3-credit or 4-credit programs, providing an opportunity for students to earn a package of credits.

- **Fit to Lead (FL):**

Experiential, 3-credit, 1 day collaborative study program, focusing on developing leadership skills and gaining volunteer and community involvement opportunities with a heavy emphasis on individual fitness and sport activities. Course selections in the program may include:

- PAL 3O, PAI 3O, GWL 3O, GPP 3O, PAD 3O, PLF 4M

- **Life Skills**

This Life Skills course provides students with an experiential learning environment where students learn practical skills for post-secondary school life. Personal finance, emergency preparedness, food handling and preparation and self-care are some of the topics in this course.

- GWL 3O, HIP 4O, IDP 3O

- **Technautics**

Sci. Tech. four-credit program focusing on Science, Math, Business, and Technology. Students will make use of information and communication technology in a business environment to build on their digital literacy. The goal is to engage students through problem-based learning while showing the relevance of numeracy across various disciplines of study.

- BTT1O, SNC1P, MFM1P, TIJ1O

- **MusicBiz**

This course provides students with a framework for producing music using computer software, with an emphasis on both the creative process and the demands of the entertainment industry.
