At SLSS, our EHS program for grade 9 and 10 students is rooted in UNESCO's Sustainable Development Goals. Through enriched experiences and certifications, our EHS students will become the problem-solvers, taskmasters and advocates that our communities need to make positive and sustainable change. Our community partners acknowledge and support this program through their commitment to experiential learning, certifications and exciting reach ahead opportunities. Students who complete the EHS program may want to apply to the SHSM: Non-Profit for grades 11 and 12.

Explore High Skills students will participate in:

- anchor courses GLS 10 in Grade 9 and PPL 20 in Grade 10
- focused learning activities related to the sector that allow students to make connections between their classroom learning and their pathway plans
- community involvement where students participate in 20 hours of volunteer activities that count towards their high school diploma
- learning skills development with specific connections made to skills required in the workplace
- certification and training in grade 9 or 10 that is sector-recognized in the workplace
- an experiential learning activity in grade 9 or 10, supported by business, community, and/or industry partners
- Individual Pathway Plan (IPP) development in myBlueprint, including post-secondary planning, career exploration, resume building and more

Social Justice and Equity Through Community Development

At Stephen Lewis Secondary School, our SHSM program is rooted in Social Justice and Equity. The goal of our program is to provide students with the opportunity to build the essential skills of critical thinking, empathy and teamwork that will be needed in the 21st Century workplace. Through enriched experiences and certifications, our SHSM students will ready themselves for post-secondary programs and the increasing employment demands facing their generation. Our community partners acknowledge and support this program through their commitment to experiential learning, certifications and exciting reach ahead opportunities.

In order to earn a SHSM Red Seal Diploma in Non-Profit, students:

1. Complete a bundle of 9 specific courses (see chart below) including 2 cooperative education credits taken in day school in the grade 11 school year;
 2. Complete 7 Certifications and/or training programs;
 3. Participate in Experiential Learning and career exploration activities within the sector (e.g. job shadowing, job twinning);
 4. Gain "Reach Ahead" experience connected to the student's post-secondary plans.
 5. Complete a Sector-Partnered Experience (SPE) in one of 3 areas: Coding; Innovation, Creativity & Entrepreneurship (ICE); or Mathematics.
